Dear Mr. Jaworski:

We represent AshBritt, Inc. as its national government contracts counsel. The purpose of this letter is to inform you that, through our local counsel, we intend to seek redress on behalf of AshBritt for your client's, and even your, tortious interference with AshBritt's contract with the City of Galveston to clean up debris resulting from Hurricane Ike.

AshBritt was awarded its clean up contract last June. The City of Galveston activated AshBritt's contract yesterday morning by issuing a notice to proceed thereunder. AshBritt, in reliance thereon, incurred significant costs to fully mobilize in order to carry out its duties under the contract. Early this morning, however, the City of Galveston notified AshBritt that, in breach of its contract, it had determined to de-activate AshBritt's contract and permit your client, DRC, to operate as the sole debris removal contractor in Galveston. We understand this decision was prompted by your actions on behalf of your client.

We believe your actions were unconscionable and a tortious interference with the contract rights of AshBritt. Unless you and your client cease and desist and AshBritt is permitted to perform under its contract, AshBritt will initiate in due course a suit against you and your client for damages, including lost profit.
